A BONNY TRIP TO SCOTLAND

The vineyard estate was built in three phases, with the final phase completed in 2000, and this state of the art facility is an education itself. Gonzalo Lainez would like nothing more than to show you around this beautiful estate and introduce to some of the finest Rioja wines being produced. And if you have time, our friend Don Cusimano of Abadia Retuerta, will be delighted to show you around his winery near the historic town of Valladolid. As if Spain were not a compelling enough destination, a chance to get an in-depth look at this exciting frontier of winemaking is truly a unique experience.
